JOB SEEKER PROGRAM

The St. Patrick – St. Anthony Job Seeker Program applied for various grants this spring and was fortunate to receive four different awards in 2018.

Westerman Foundation \$1,000: This grant will assist the Job Seeker program to purchase a new copier/printer for use by both the office staff and clients searching for specific positions and development of resumes.

JSJ Corporation; Grand Haven, MI \$5,000: These funds are to be used specifically for the purchase of new computer equipment in the Job Seeker office, providing computer and internet access as a West Michigan WORKS! "Share Access" site.

Catholic Campaign For Human Development - Catholic Charities West Michigan, Diocese of Grand Rapids - \$6,000: This grant will provide networking opportunities, coaching, mentoring, resume and cover letter development, community resources and support to job seekers in their job search to obtain successful careers in the Tri-Cities and surrounding areas.

Zenko Family Field Of Interest Fund of the Grand Haven Area Community Foundation (CCHD) - \$10,000: Funds to be used to:

- Support Job Seeker Program salaries for "direct assistance" and assessment to the unemployed, underemployed, and those with barriers
- Maintain social media support for displaced workers looking for new employment opportunities
- Host a monthly networking breakfast bringing area businesses and job seekers together to meet both the employment and recruiting needs of all involved
- Meet the needs to assist Love In Action's Hope House and Harbor Hall sheltered housing residents obtain employment
- Supervise West Michigan WORKS! Welfare Reform Program Worksite recipients for the purpose of on-the job training in conjunction with their Food Assistance Employment and Training Program. This is a component of its overall welfare reform initiative
- Collaborate with Goodwill Industries of West Michigan providing clothing vouchers to job seekers in need of apparel during their job search and interview process

We acknowledge the foundations who are assisting the Job Seeker Program. Together with our local business partners, we work to find employment opportunities, prepare individuals for employment, remove barriers and support them until job seekers can get back on their feet.

DONOR WALL



The parish capital campaign, which formally launched in October 2014, is the largest financial commitment to the St. Patrick-St. Anthony Parish in church history. Donors who made a pledge or a one-time gift were promised a suitable tribute for their sacrifice of treasure. In addition, those donors who wished to honor, or memorialize a loved one, were given an opportunity to do so when their gift was made. Over 1000 donations were received between 2014 and December 2017 and, these donors are named on the glass panels mounted to the southeast wall of the Gathering Space near the east entrance.

The glass panels measuring 36 inches wide, eight feet tall were formerly in the main entrance of Mercy Hospital in Muskegon. We were able to salvage and repurpose the half-inch thick panels and they look great in our space. We are thankful to Claudine Weber for helping to make the connection with Mercy Health. Bob Wassick made the framing material and mounted the panels with the help of volunteers. (Bob Butler handled the panels several times and can attest that they are extremely heavy.) The panels reflect the theme of the campaign, "Opening Doors to Welcome and Serve".

- Panel # 1 features the word "Welcome" in several languages to remind us of our diversity and welcoming spirit.
- Panel # 2 shares a statement in the dark brown header from Fr. Bill Langlois who was pastor at the beginning of the campaign and the inspiration for the project. Names of 250 donors follow.
- Panel # 3 features a picture of the stained glass window of St. Patrick located on the north side of the church balcony. Below the header, there is a second collection of 240 donors.
- Panel # 4 honors St. Anthony. This header reflects the stained glass window located on the south wall of the church balcony.
 Another 250 donor names are listed below the header.
- Panel # 5 reflects a statement on behalf of Fr. Chuck Schwartz, our current pastor who was installed at the parish in 2016 just prior to the groundbreaking ceremony for the project. Below the header are the names of the final 250 donors.
- Panel # 6 features the word "Serve" and highlights several ministries of the parish. Additionally this panel pays tribute to memorials
 of our parishioners who died during the capital project and chose the parish project as a memorial fund offering. Also featured are
 our Foundations, Corporate Donors, and Major Bequests.

The last panel has an area that will honor pledges to the Capital Fund that are received after January 1, 2018. If you would like to become a part of the donor wall, contributions are still being accepted.

DEDICATION BOOK OPENING DOORS TO WELCOME AND SERVE

The Dedication Book was produced to "historically" record the beautiful construction and renovation elements of our capital project, "Opening Doors to Welcome and Serve". Sheila Steffel, one of the campaign's three co-directors, and John Strazanac used the green velvet covered dedication book from 1957 as a model. Highlights from past church historical books, and as well as articles from various contributors were collected and compiled for this edition. Some key writers include the following:

Haiti Trip 2018

On June 9-16th Jose Astua, Joyce Bies, Maureen and Mike Scott, Katie, Mary and Chris Fojtik, and Jean Kowalski, from Gesu Parish, travelled to our sister parish in Haiti.

We met with the Parish Council after Sunday morning Mass. They related some of the needs of the church (12 batteries to complete the solar energy system, closet and countertop for sacristy, sound system updates, Humeral Veil and Cope, monstrance, altar clothes and linens w/ liturgical colors, pews, electronic bell, seal door to stop rain from getting in, choir loft floor needs finishing (tiles).) They expressed their gratitude for all we do for their Parish. Joyce met with the scholarship students in the afternoon who were also very grateful for our support.

We were pleased to meet Father Simon Jonas who is assisting Father Roosevelt to run the school. We were also very happy to be told that Father had hired a preschool teacher and three school support employees with tuition dollars collected from those families who can afford it — a big step in sustainability!

We visited the elementary school and met with the teachers after school. Some of their needs are: games for the Pre-K and Kindergarten classrooms, trash cans, boom box/portable sound system, teacher desks, roof repair.

We met with the secondary school teachers as well. Their greatest needs were: transportation to and from Port-au-Prince (2 motorcycles), materials to help learn English, French, and Spanish, sports uniforms and soccer balls. Jean Kowalski met with the nurses at the clinic, visited the chicken farm and the water purifying system all of which are funded by Gesu.


Joyce gave the top students in each class a gift for their efforts and the top teachers in the elementary and secondary school were also rewarded while we were there. We all enjoyed spending time with parishioners and also were able to hand out some of the items you generously donated to our Haiti shipment.

Father Roosevelt will be visiting us September 14th-19th. There will be a second collection at all Masses to help cover the cost of the secondary school, which totals \$46,000 for the year. Or, if you would like to sponsor an individual student in the secondary school (cost is \$250/year, which will be applied to the \$46,000) please contact Joyce Bies at beezer22@sbcglobal.net or 616-847-1382. On Saturday we will have a potluck dinner after the 5pm Mass where parishioners will have an opportunity to meet Father and ask any questions. On Sunday there will be a pancake breakfast after the 9 and 11am Masses. Please help us educate the children of Sts. Simon and Jude! We were able to fund the 2017/2018 school year because of your generosity and hope to do the same for 2018/2019. God Bless You for your kindness and support!
